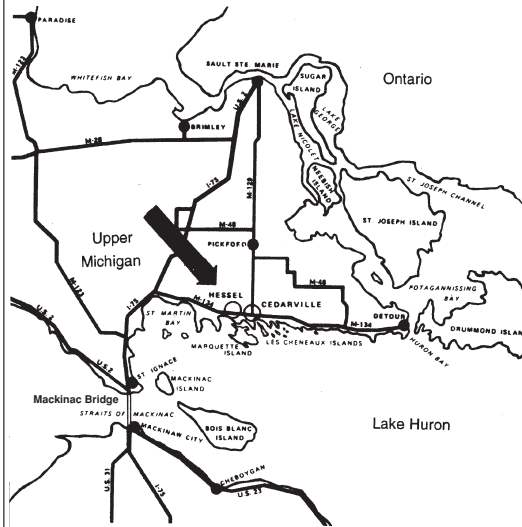

The Les Cheneaux Islands are in Michigan's Eastern Upper Peninsula. There are 36 sheltered islands surrounded by crystal clear Lake Huron, just 35 miles north and east of the "Mighty Mac" bridge.

The mainland communities of Cedarville and Hessel offer shopping, accommodations, and business services.

Les Cheneaux has a rich heritage in boat building and repair. Our craftsmen continue to offer some of the finest restoration and repair services available.

The boat show is held the second weekend in August at the public marina in Hessel. Features at the boat show include: travel-lift adjacent to show and launch ramps at the show site, nautical exhibits, live entertainment during the day, boat excursions of the Les Cheneaux Islands, food and beverage concessions, and demonstrations. Maximum exposure, maximum appreciation. There is an admission charge for spectators.

Hessel can be reached by air, boat or highway. Our paved runway at the Albert Lindberg Airport is 3,700 feet long. If traveling via highway, take Exit 359 off I-75 and go east on M-134 just 16 miles.

The Boat Show

The Les Cheneaux Islands Antique Wooden Boat Show, held each year in Hessel, Michigan, has been a center of attraction since it began in 1978. The show boasts over 150 entries each year, and is easily the largest show featuring antique and classic wood boats.

Some of the country's finest boats call beautiful Les Cheneaux Islands home. Most of these boats are used daily during the summer months as a primary mode of transportation to and from the cottages dotting the area's sheltered islands.

Entries in the Les Cheneaux Islands Antique Wooden Boat Show arrive each August from as far as California and Florida and include dinghies, rowboats, canoes, large cruisers, steam and gas-powered launches, sailboats, utilities, and runabouts.

The Antique Wooden Boat Show is sponsored by the Les Cheneaux Historical Association, in cooperation with Mertaugh Boat Works, Hessel Harbor Association and the Hessel Marina. The Historical Association uses the proceeds from this event, along with other contributions, to maintain and enhance the Historical Museum and the Maritime Museum, which are located in nearby Cedarville.

Be sure to stop by the Historical and Maritime museums while attending the Antique Wooden Boat Show and relive the rich history of our area.



Festival of Arts

Held in conjunction with the Antique Wooden Boat Show each year is the Festival of Arts. Artists and craftspersons display and sell a variety of artwork, including photographs, paintings, pottery, wood toys, dolls, textiles, glass, jewelry and many other items. Around 70 of the state's finest artists will be showing and selling their work in this juried show.
